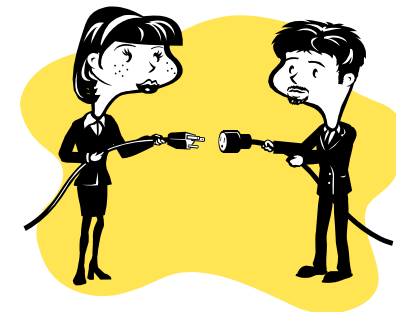

FAQ #1

- **Who can apply to go on the tour?**

Every Grinnell College student can apply.

FAQ #2

- **How many students will be selected to go on the trip and how will the applications be rated?**

- 2. Related academic interest*
- 3. Related career interest*

- **What if I'm going home for the first week of spring break?**

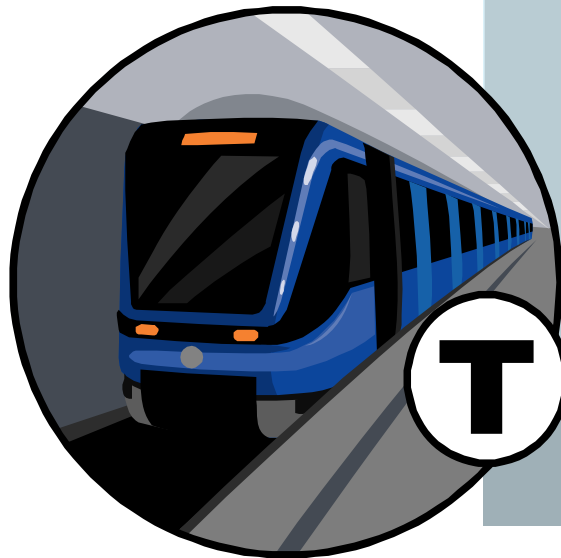
Unless you plan to be in New York during the first week of break, we will expect all student participants to travel with us on Monday from Grinnell.
